Sauvignon blanc, Le Tuffeau, IGP d'Oc, France 2017 Le Tuffeau is a super-fresh, zippy sauvignon with vibrant, ripe citrus-fruit aromas. The grapes are sourced from vineyards near the beautiful town of Carcassonne in Southern France.	£18.50	£12.70	£4.60	£6.60
